

Reminder Rosie Introduces Calendar Date Reminders Helps Age at Homers' Loneliness, Safety, Forgetfulness & Frustration

Reminder Rosie is now equipped with the latest cutting-edge voice recognition technology and an improved user-interface, telling users to take medication, or any personalized ADL reminder, at a certain time of day- everyday, weekly, and now by calendar date and even annually.

Now, up to twenty-five spoken reminder alarms are digitally recorded in the caregivers' comforting voice, in any language, for any important reminder or message. Once the task is completed, the person either says "reminder off" or touches Rosie to turn it off. No need to fuss with small buttons.

One major problem in healthcare is that short doctor visits are insufficient to communicate healthcare information. Seniors often require ongoing reminders for medications, treatment regimens and ADL tasks. Sustained increase in medication adherence is a key benefit and easily addressed with specific medication reminders, i.e. "Dad, its Michael, take your five white and one blue pill after breakfast"...9:00 AM everyday, or, "Mom, don't forget your doctor is appointment is in one hour"...2PM, December 15, 2014. Rosie's flexibility allows for proactive wellness reminders, for example "Mom, I love you. Make sure you go for your walk today", as well as any imaginable ADL reminder; "...feed the cat", "...pay the credit card bill", "...its Justins' Birthday today, don't forget to call your favorite Grandson" etc.

Reminder-Rosie's loud spoken alarms may be heard from more than 100 feet away. Her incredible simplicity responds to questions and commands such as: "Today's Reminders?", "What day is it?" to help elders organize their day and reduce their frustration of independence. "Reminder off" and more. It features a battery back-up in case of power outs.

Proven in test trials and reviewed by health care professionals and industry experts, Reminder-Rosie's simplicity engages the care recipient with family members/caregivers and HC providers. The outcome significantly increases seniors' independence, their ability to stay at home longer, and gives valuable peace of mind to caregivers, reducing their stress.
